
## **DAVID KRUPP**

After college, I moved back to where my family relocated in Southern California and became familiar with Mammoth Mountain. Joined Century City Ski Club in 2007 and

resurrected my racing career in the club league. As an active club member, I was President twice, Summer Trips Coordinator for a few years, and LA Council Representative. I feel grateful for being voted Man of the Year for my club. From there, I became involved in Los Angeles Council of Ski Clubs and was president twice.

Because of our affiliation with Far West Ski Association, my next endeavor was VP of Membership with the organization. Next step, Trustee for 2 years. After, I became the Chairman of the Athletic Scholarship Program which I have been doing for the last 10 or so years. I am also thankful to Far West for being given the J. Stanley Mullin award for outstanding service to the organization.

In 2010, I joined the Masters Team at Mammoth Mountain, where, until recently, I skied an average of 80 days a year, with about half of those involved in race training. After a water-skiing injury in 2016, I officially retired from ski racing after the 2017-2018 ski season.

Currently, I am still going on trips with my ski club, out-of-state trips throughout the west, and, on occasion, Europe. I am still coordinating the FWSA Scholarship Program and am a Trustee of the Far West Ski Foundation. I am fortunate for my involvement in such a great sport and am looking forward to the years to come.
